Application for Global Internship Award

The Curriculum in Global Studies is pleased to announce a call for proposals for monetary awards to support our Undergraduate students who have secured/are securing internationally focused internships for Summer 2016. The aim is to provide financial support so that students can pursue an internship that will advance their academic and professional careers. Internships should be a *minimum* of six weeks, and can be based in the US or abroad. While students can conduct research during the period of their internship, this is not a fieldwork grant. The primary purpose is for the student to gain the day-to-day experience of working in a non-profit, business, or other institution. Individual grants will not exceed \$1,000.

To apply, please submit:

- Complete CV, including contact information, degree details, and work, volunteer, and other relevant experience
- One or two page description (double-spaced, 12-point font) of the internship, explaining how it will advance your education and career goals and any other relevant information.
- A detailed budget, including additional funding being pursued.
- A brief letter of support from a UNC faculty member; form available [here](#).
- When possible, a letter from the internship organization, verifying the student's placement.

Requirements:

- Student must be a declared Global Studies Major.
- Internships must be a minimum of six weeks.
- You must be returning to UNC after the internship.
- You must keep and submit a journal.
- You must write a two-to-four-page report summarizing and reflecting upon the experience, due within the first week of classes.

Evaluation criteria:

- Applications will be evaluated according to the following three criteria:
 - overall merit of the project in relation to student academic and career goals;
 - demonstrated engagement with global issues in and beyond the classroom; and
 - faculty references.

**Study Abroad experiences, language training, field research, service projects and self-enrichment ARE NOT eligible.*
